
P.S. DuPont Middle School is an average Delaware school of over 950 students. The students come to school, learn, and most enjoy the experience of P.R.I.D.E.






BOYS' VARSITY BASKETBALL

-continued from page 1...... DuPont's head principal to obtain his thoughts and opinions on the causes for the increase in fights. He identified multiple reasons why he believes school fights have become more common. One reason may be social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn, Tumblr, etc.) People can and have used these sites to start rumors and gossip about classmates in school. They then spread it to all of their followers on the site. Eventually the student the first one was trying to hurt would hear about the news, whether it was on the site or at school. If it got to the person in summer, if they knew who started it, they may wait till school starts again to "settle scores." Or if school is in session, they can spread to their followers about them "planning a fight." The next day in school they engage them and a fight could ensue. Although social media sites are not the only reason fights occur. There is also another scenario; horseplay. When students are horse playing, one of them could throw a real punch, or kick hard. The other person could become angry, and an argument could follow. Then, if a student becomes infuriated enough, the joking around horseplay could turn into a fight. This can also happen for jokes. Saying the wrong type of joke can hurt feelings, which could result in a fight, one of the many reasons it is important to think before you speak, choosing words



carefully.While

some students can be impulsive and become angry easily, this is not the norm here at P.S. Mr. Cheatwood described fighting as "very abnormal for our school." Most students, when they fight are remorseful, and with consequences like 3-5 days of suspension, alternate suspension, and assault charges, students usually learn from their mistakes pretty quickly. It is almost always their first and last fight. The fact is, only a small percentage of students in P.S. have actually got into a fight or are interested in it. Most are passive and want to avoid conflict by peacefully talking things through. But this does not mean the school accepts fighting. Mr. Cheatwood assures that

teachers and staff are helpful, and encourages students to speak to them if they have problems. "We are here to help," he said. If you or your friends hear of an upcoming fight, whether it is in school or by social media, immediately tell a trusted adult. Your name will remain anonymous. If your friends are planning to fight, try to calm them down. Explain to them why fighting is not a solution to their problems. If they still won't listen, report about the fight to an adult. You do not need to name your friend's name, only about the fight. These reports can help to keep other students safe in school.
