In closing, thank you for your commitment to your child's education and I look forward to seeing you in the near future!



# P.S. Panther Pride (Positive Behavior Support Program)

P - Perseverance, R - Respect, I - Integrity, D -Demonstrate, E - Excellence in Academics

Students receive verbal praise for displaying those expected behaviors of middle school students. Students can regularly earn blue **PRIDE CARDS** for displaying those behaviors. The students trade-in their PRIDE CARDS on Fridays in the "DEN" located in the PS duPont Cafeteria. Here they can buy items such as school supplies, locker items, special time with a teacher after school, or buy larger prizes such as PS gear, attending a swim party or, going up to the cupola and getting a picture of him/her self to prove it.

In order to run a successful program we hold two annual fundraisers. One is our spaghetti dinner held in the cafeteria scheduled for September 25th. # **District Moves to a 10-Point Grading Scale**



The Brandywine School District is converting to a 10-point grading scale for students in grades 4-12, starting this school year. The new scale will frame the grade system to match the achievement levels and expectations established by the Common Core State Standards, which are very challenging and based on college-readiness skills. The change was recommended by the District's Grade Reporting Committee and approved by the School Board.

The new grading scale will in no way lower the rigorous standards presently found in the District's grade 4-12 classrooms. Teachers will continue to hold students accountable for mastering those standards, and students will be challenged to achieve at the highest levels.

"Right now is a perfect opportunity to transition to a 10-point grading scale because of BSD's adoption of the Common Core State Standards and the increased rigor associated with the standards," explained Dr. Michelle Kutch, the District's Supervisor of Curriculum. "Student proficiency and mastery of the standards will be accurately measured on a 10-point scale."

The District's research into the issue revealed that many other districts already use a 10-point grading scale. This put our students at a potential disadvantage when it came to competition or college admissions and/or scholarships because a student earning a 92 in another district would receive an A on their report card, while a BSD student earning a 92 would receive a B under our old grading scale. "Adjusting the grading scale to a 10-point scale will level the playing field for our students and ensure fairness and consistency," said Dr. Kutch. "In addition, the new scale will be aligned with the grading scale used by most colleges and universities. Grading consistency with college grading will lead to smoother transitions for our students when they enter college.



# **Need to Know News**

This section provides important information about activities for P.S. families.



From the Nurses Desk

I would like to introduce myself. I am Robin Collins, your school nurse. My nursing experience is not only in School Nursing, but also the behavioral/psychiatric aspect as well. My approach in dealing with your child will be one of patience as well as being an educator. In my opinion, when children have a better understanding of some of their medical concerns/questions, they often become their own teachers. If you have any questions or concerns, I would be more than happy to discuss them with you. I wish you and your child a very happy (and a healthy) productive year at P.S. duPont Middle School.

#### A few highlights from the Nursing Office:

**Medications:** must arrive to the nursing office in the original, pharmacy labeled container with a note completed by the parent giving me permission to administer the medication. Over the counter medication must be identifiable in its original packaging. No medication will be administered without either of the above in place.

**Back screenings:** I will be checking every child's back for scoliosis (a curvature of the spine). This will occur in gym classes early in September for the first semester and in late January for those students that have gym in the second semester. If I find any unusual findings or if I suspect a slight curvature, your child will be referred to a physical therapist that will be visiting the school early in 2014. I will send you a note closer to the time of the physical therapist's visit.

**Vision/Hearing Screenings:** all 7<sup>th</sup> graders vision and hearing will be tested in October/November. Parents/guardians will be informed if there were any difficulties/abnormalities with the screening results.

**Sports Physicals:** required for all students that are interested in trying out and/or playing any school sponsored sport. The physical needs to have been completed on or after May 1, 2013. A DIAA sports physical form is the only form accepted for school sponsored sports. It can be found on the P:S. website. Your child can have the physical performed by their primary doctor, a walk-in clinic or even here at P.S. on 9/4/13 after school. This is the only time we will offer this opportunity, so please take advantage of it if your child may be interested in playing any sport/ club. The cost is \$ 25.00 cash. In order for any student to partake in this physical, page 1, 2 and most of page 4 of the sport physical must be completed and signed by a parent and turned into the Nurse prior to 9/4/13. The student must turn in their money to the doctor on September 4<sup>th</sup>. I will not collect this money or be responsible for its safety.

The Sunday Academy is a partnership between PS duPont Middle School and Child Inc. offering a "Healthy Relationship" curriculum to parents and students which was approved by the Department of Education for middle school students. The Sunday Academy will be scheduled over seven sessions from 2pm to 4pm beginning September 22<sup>nd</sup> and ending December 15<sup>th</sup>. Each week a group of students and their parent/guardian will be separated

for group discussion on a new topic which will be adapted to the group to include current events and time for discussion. Topics to be covered include:

- 10/20 Gender Roles & Stereotypes
- 11/3 Media Literacy
- 11/17 Boundaries and Self Worth
- 12/1 Healthy vs. Unhealthy Relationships

Parents/guardian lessons will be restructured, as well as helping them to communicate and have conversations with their teenager about the "Healthy Relationship" topics being taught to their child.
